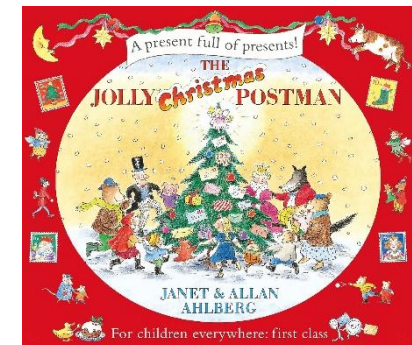
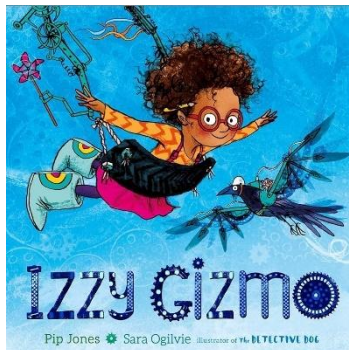
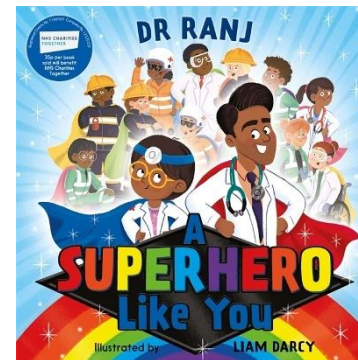


Who changed the world?

Year 1 and Year 2

Autumn 2

<p>Week 1</p>	<p>In Maths, year 2s will be subtracting two 2 digit numbers not crossing the ten and then crossing the ten. Then they will be doing mixed addition and subtraction problems. Year 1s will complete the end of unit test for Place Value (within 10) and learn fact families and number bonds within 10.</p> <p>In English, year 1 and 2 children will be exploring firework poetry. Children will listen to different fireworks and think of good describing words. They will explore key vocabulary and learn how to use Onomatopoeia effectively.</p> <p>In Topic, Year 1 and 2 will revisit the meaning of discrimination. They will explore what discrimination might look like and recognise the importance of treating everyone with kindness and respect.</p> <p>In Science, the children will be using their knowledge about waterproof materials to design a waterproof shelter for Incy Wincy Spider.</p> <p>In RE, the children will be learning about the Islamic New Year and the journey of the Prophet Mohammed from Mecca to Medina.</p> <p>In Music, the children will begin their preparation for their Christmas Performance.</p> <p>In PE, children will do their final dance lesson, applying key movements and travel methods such as gallop, spin, skip to create a bonfire. The children will use ribbons to become different fireworks, like the Catherine wheel, rockets and roman candles. To the music 'In the hall of the mountain king', changing the speed of their movements depending on the pace of the music.</p> <p>In Computing, the children will recognise and identify keys on a keyboard, use them to log themselves in, and open a word processor.</p> <p>In PSHE, the children will begin to understand that people sometimes make assumptions about boys and girls (stereotypes) and will recognise some of the similarities between them.</p>
<p>Week 2</p>	<p>In Maths, the year 2 children will be comparing number sentences and solving missing number problems. They will then be recognising 2d and 3d shapes. They will count the sides and vertices of 2d shapes and draw them. Year 1 children will look at systematic number bonds to 10 and number bonds to 10.</p> <p>In English, year 1 and 2 children will perform verses of the modelled firework poem and learn how to use the suffix 'ing' for words like fizzing. They will also recap using verbs and learn how to use exclamation marks to make their poems more effective. Year 2 children will plan and write their poems, ready to edit and perform.</p> <p>In Topic, the children will learn about the Suffragette Movement, exploring what the Suffragettes were campaigning and protesting for, as well as finding out about the key individuals involved in the movement.</p> <p>In Science, the children will be exploring materials and objects that float and sink and they will be making predictions and set up a comparable test to investigate.</p> <p>In RE, the children will be finding out about the Day of Ashura</p>

	<p>In Music, the children will continue preparing for their Christmas Performance.</p> <p>In PE, children will start their gymnastic unit focusing on learning core shapes, such as: straight tuck, pike, straddle.</p> <p>In Computing, the children will learn to enter text into a word processor, using letter, number, and space keys, and will be able to use the Backspace key to remove text.</p> <p>In PSHE, the children will begin to understand that people sometimes make assumptions about boys and girls (stereotypes) and will recognise some of the differences between them.</p>
<p>Week 3</p>	<p>In Maths, the year 2 children will be looking at lines of symmetry on shapes and using lines of symmetry to complete shapes and sorting 2d shapes in different ways. Year 1 children explore addition – adding more, addition problems and learn how to find a part.</p> <p>In English, Squirrels will plan their poems and publish them through performing to the class. Hedgehogs and Shrews will look at creating a fact file on firefighters, linking to our topic on significant people. They will explore a modelled texts and learn about the features of a fact file.</p> <p>In Topic, the children will learn about Rosa Parks, why she is remembered, and how her actions helped to challenge unfair laws and inspire the Civil Rights Movement.</p> <p>In Science, the children will be applying their learning from last week about whether objects float or sink by creating a boat that will float that can hold a character. They will then interpret their results.</p> <p>In RE, the children will be finding out more about how Muslims celebrate Mawlid al-Nabi.</p> <p>In Music, the children will continue preparing for their Christmas Performance.</p> <p>In PE, children will recap the core shapes learn last week and explore ways to travel, for example roll. In small groups they will create a short sequence that incorporates a balance, form of travel and a core shape.</p> <p>In Computing, the children will learn to type using capital letters and begin to identify the toolbar, using features such as bold, italic, and underline to edit their work.</p> <p>In PSHE, the children will understand that bullying can sometimes be linked to differences and recognise how bullying might make someone feel.</p>
<p>Week 4</p>	<p>In Maths, the year 2 children will be counting edges, faces and vertices on 3d shapes. Year 1 children will learn the 8 fact families and begin subtraction by take/away and crossing out and they will learn how to subtract on a number line.</p> <p>In English, Squirrels will explore scenes from the North Pole and use adjectives to describe the photos. As their hook lesson, the children will go on a treasure hunt and discover the story ‘The Jolly Postman.’ Children will look at the letters written in this book before looking at a modelled letter to Father Christmas and explore key features of a good letter. Shrews and Hedgehogs will build up to writing a fact file on firefighters and publish this.</p>

	<p>In Topic, the children will reflect on the amazing, significant individuals they've learned about this Autumn, and begin to consider how they can change the world too.</p> <p>In Science, the children will be looking at a variety of every day materials and objects and exploring which ones are magnetic.</p> <p>In RE, the children will learn about the Muslim month of Ramadan.</p> <p>In Music, the children will continue preparing for their Christmas Performance.</p> <p>In PE, children will recap travel, balance and core shapes to create, practise & refine longer, more complex sequences including changes in level, direction, speed & shape.</p> <p>In Computing, the children will learn how to make changes to a text by selecting words (e.g., double-clicking or clicking and dragging to select all) and by changing the font.</p> <p>In PSHE, the children will learn to recognise what is right and wrong and understand how to look after themselves. They will know when and how to stand up for themselves and others, and understand how to seek help if they are being bullied.</p>
<p>Week 5</p>	<p>In Maths, the year 2 children will be sorting 3d shapes and making patterns using 2d and 3d shapes. Year 1 will consolidate their learning by recapping addition and subtraction and then they will start their unit on shape, focusing on 2D shapes.</p> <p>In English, Squirrels will plan their letter to Father Christmas, learn how to make words plural using s and es, as well as learning how to use the personal pronoun I correctly within sentences. Shrews and Hedgehogs will explore the modelled text letter to Father Christmas, explore key features and look at using prefixes and suffixes. All of the classes will orally rehearse their letter and practise spelling common exception words and key tier 2 and 3 vocabulary.</p> <p>In Topic, the children will continue to reflect on how they can make a difference in the world today. They will create a <i>Little People, Big Dreams</i> style book to celebrate their aspirations.</p> <p>In Science, the children will be playing the material game which will help them to consolidate all their previous learning on properties of materials. They will be going around the room asking other children questions about their mystery card which has an object / material on and they have to guess what it is based on its properties.</p> <p>In RE, the children will learn out how Muslims celebrate Eid al-Fitr to mark the end of Ramadan.</p> <p>In Music, the children will put their final magic touches to their Christmas Performance.</p> <p>In PE, children will learn how to set up and put away the gymnastics equipment, and travel safely across the apparatus. Once the children are confident they will start to create, a sequence of controlled movements on the apparatus.</p> <p>In Computing, the children will explain what tools they have used to change a text, reflect on whether their changes have improved their writing, and use the 'Undo' function to remove changes if needed.</p>

	In PSHE , the children will understand that it is OK to be different from others and that friendships can be formed regardless of differences. They will recognise that we should not judge people for being different.
Week 6	<p>In Maths, the children will be doing their end of term assessments. Year 1 children will learn about 3D shapes, focusing on finding their properties, then they will learn how to create patterns with 2D and 3D shapes.</p> <p>In English, the children will write their letter to Father Christmas and post it.</p> <p>In DT, the children will learn how to use wheels and axles to design, plan, create, and evaluate a vehicle with a purpose of helping others.</p> <p>In Science, the children will be completing their challenge wheel end of unit assessment.</p> <p>In Music, the children will proudly perform their Christmas Show!</p> <p>In PE, children will continue to create more complex sequences of controlled movements on the apparatus and perform this to the class.</p> <p>In Computing, the children will explain the differences between typing and writing and express their own preference, giving reasons for why they prefer one over the other.</p> <p>In PSHE, the children will talk about some of the ways they are different from their friends and recognise that these differences make everyone special and unique.</p>
Week 7	<p>All things Christmas!</p> <p>In Maths, the year 2 children will be doing Christmas themed place value, addition and subtraction and shape maths problems. Year 1 children will complete their end of unit test for Addition and Subtraction and engage in Christmas themed activities to consolidate learning from both the place value and addition and subtraction unit.</p> <p>In English, the children will be completing some writing challenges set by the elves to practise sentence structure and consolidate learning from the autumn term.</p> <p>In RE, the children will be discovering more about Hajj – the Muslim pilgrimage to Mecca.</p>
