

Week 1	Science topic Rocks and Soils	
	Topic WOW starter: The children will be creating pebble pets.	
	Lesson 1 - How are different rocks created? Children to look at metamorphic, igneous and sedimentary rocks and the	
	differences in how they were formed.	
	English	
	The Year 3 Foxes will start reading Oliver & the Seawigs'. They will make predictions about the text and learn about	
	expanded noun phrases.	
	The Year 3 and 4 Moles will be reading 'The Pebble in my pocket'. They will make predictions about the text, write a	
	group poem describing pebbles, draw images as described in the text and write a description of the pebble's journey.	
	The Year 4 Rabbits will start reading Oliver & the Seawigs. They will read the first chapter and learn about the different seatons at the sea	
	sentence types.	
	Maths: the learning focus will be Place Value. The children will learn to represent and partition numbers to 100. In year	
	the children look at representing and partitioning numbers to 1000.	
	In R.E the children will learn about the Harvest festival and how it is celebrated around the world.	
	<b>French</b> – The children will be learning how to say their name, age, numbers to 10 and greetings.	
	<b>PSHE</b> – the children will be naming feelings	
	In <b>Music</b> the year 3 children will begin to learn how to hold a string instrument carefully, and how to take out the instrument. The year 4 children will learn to sing Harvest songs

	<b>The Year 3 Foxes</b> will continue reading 'Oliver & the Seawigs' and think of relevant questions to ask a character. They w	
	also learn about the features of a character description and learn how to use commas in a list in order to write a charact	
	description.	
	<b>The Year 3 and 4 Moles</b> will start reading 'Oliver and the Seawigs'. They will make predictions about the text and lear	
	about expanded noun phrases. They will also be looking at the features of a character description in order to write one.	
	<b>The Year 4 Rabbits</b> will continue reading Oliver & the Seawigs and start to work on writing a character description.	
	The real + hassing will continue reading onver & the seawigs and start to work on writing a character description.	

	In <b>Maths</b> the year 3 children will represent and partition numbers to 1000. In year 4 the children will represent and partition numbers up to 10,000.
	In R.E the children will learn about the Harvest festival and how it is celebrated around the world.
	In P.E this half term, the focus will be yoga. We will follow Routine A and focus on correct breathing and flexibility. In French the children will be learning about birthdays, days and months of the year.
	PSHE – the children will be learning to recognise their feelings
	In <b>Music</b> the year 3 children will begin to learn to pluck simple notes on a string instrument. The year 4 children will learn to sing Harvest songs.
	In <b>Computing</b> , the children will finding out what a school network looks like.
Week 3	Science topic Rocks and Soils
	Lesson 3 – What secrets are hidden within the rocks? We will describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things
	that have lived are trapped within rock by explaining the fossilisation process and by comparing fossils to the animals they
	belong to.
	English
	The Foxes and Moles will learn about the features of instructions and they will learn how to use conjunctions to express
	time and cause and imperative verbs. They will continue to read 'Oliver and the Seawigs' and practise summarising and
	retrieving.
	<b>The Year 4 Rabbits</b> will continue to read Oliver and the Seawigs and answer comprehension questions about the text. They will also learn about subordinating conjunctions.
	In <b>Maths</b> this week the children in year 3 will compare and order numbers to 1000. Year 4 will use a number line to 10,000 and estimate where numbers would be placed on a number line.
	In R.E we will begin to rehearse for our Harvest festival.
	In <b>P.E</b> this half term, the focus will be yoga. We will follow Routine B and focus on balance and co-ordination and body
	awareness.
	In French the children will follow and understand simple classroom commands.
	In <b>PSHE</b> the children will identify positive things about themselves and set personal goals.
	In <b>Music</b> the year 3 children will continue to learn to pluck simple notes on a string instrument. The year 4 children will learn
	to sing Harvest songs.
	In <b>Computing</b> , we will be learning about the internet

Science topic Rocks and Soils
Lesson 4 – Who was Mary Anning? The children will find out about the life and works of Mary Anning and read, 'Stone girl,
Bone girl'. They will explain Mary Anning's contribution to palaeontology.
English
<b>The Foxes and Moles</b> will continue reading, 'Oliver and the Seawigs' and investigate how an author chooses words and explain the meaning of words in context. They will be using the text to gather information about the sea-monkeys and plan a set of instructions on how to care for them.
<b>The Year 4 Rabbits</b> will continue to read Oliver and the Seawigs and will be making inferences on the story. They will write their own poster to advertise the Night of the Seawigs.
In <b>Maths</b> this week the year 3 children will be adding and subtracting 1, 10 and 1000. The year 4 children will learn about Roman numerals and rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.
In R.E the children will continue to rehearse for their Harvest production.
In <b>P.E</b> this half term, the focus will be yoga. We will follow Routine C and focus on core strength and relaxation.
In French, the children will be talking about personality.
In <b>PSHE</b> the children will think about how to face new challenges positively and ask for help when needed.
In <b>Music</b> , the children in year 3 will be introduced to their bow. The year 4 children will learn to sing Harvest songs.
In <b>Computing</b> , the children will be learning about how information is shared.
Science topic Rocks and Soils
<b>Lesson 5 – What is soil?</b> The children will recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter by explaining how soil is formed.
English
<b>The Foxes and Moles</b> will write a set of instructions on how to care for sea-monkeys for an assessed piece of writing. They will also recap apostrophes for contraction. They will continue reading, 'Oliver and the Seawigs' and design a seawig.
<b>The Year 4 Rabbits</b> will continue to read Oliver and the Seawigs and will write a non-chronological report on sea monkeys.
In <b>Maths</b> the year 3 children will be adding and subtracting across 10 and 100. The year 4 children will add 2 four-digit numbers, with and without exchanges.
In R.E the children will continue to rehearse for their Harvest production.
In <b>P.E</b> this half term, the focus will be yoga. We will follow Routine D and focus on greater confidence and improved
concentration.
In French, the children will be describing friends and family members.

	In <b>PSHE</b> we will discuss how actions affect ourselves and others.
	In <b>Music,</b> the year 3 children will begin to use their bow when playing simple tunes, and learn action songs.
	In <b>Computing</b> the children will be learning about websites and how they function.
Week 6	Science topic Rocks and Soils
	Lesson 6 – Can I use soil to solve a mystery? We are going on a trip to a Field study centre (Monday 9 <sup>th</sup> October).
	Harvest: We will perform our Harvest assembly this week to parents (Thursday 12 <sup>th</sup> October)
	English
	The Foxes and Moles will continue reading, 'Oliver and the Seawigs' and they will be making inferences. They will also look
	at features of persuasive texts and evaluate a selection of persuasive posters. They will learn about rhetorical questions
	and how to use them.
	The Year 4 Rabbits will continue to read Oliver and the Seawigs and will be learning to understand the language the author
	uses.
	Maths the year 3 children will add and subtract 2 numbers, with and without exchanges. The year 4 children will subtract
	2 four- digit numbers with and without exchanges.
	In <b>P.E</b> this half term, the focus will be yoga. We will design our own sequence in pairs using 3 floor poses and 3 standing
	poses. We will focus on balance correct posture.
	In French, the children will continue learning about friends and family members.
	In <b>Music</b> , year 3 will continue to practice playing simple notes using their bow. In year 4, the children will learn to sing
	Harvest songs.

Week 7	Science topic Rocks and Soils
	Lesson 7 – When does rock become art? We will be looking at the sculptures created by artist, Henry Moore and making
	our own sculpture from clay.
	<b>The Foxes and Moles</b> will continue reading, 'Oliver and the Seawigs' and retrieve information from the text. They will recap
	different sentence types – questions, statements and exclamations. They will develop their persuasive language and design
	and create a persuasive poster.
	<b>The Year 4 Rabbits</b> will complete Oliver and the Seawigs and will summarise the story and its themes. The children will be writing instructions on how to look after an anima of their choice from the book.
	In Maths this week in year 3, the children will learn to add and subtract 2-and 3-digit numbers. The year 4 children will make
	estimations and learn strategies to check their accuracy.

In P.E this half term, the focus will be yoga. We will perform our own sequence in pairs using 3 floor poses and 3 standing
poses and teach it to another pair. We will evaluate each other's sequences based on an agreed class success criteria.
In French, the children will be learning about Halloween celebrations.
In <b>PSHE</b> the children will work collaboratively to make responsible choices.
In <b>Computing</b> , the children will be learning about who actually owns the web?
